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#### **Program Requirements**

Mellon Research Fellows should expect to spend an average of 5-10 hours per week on all aspects of the program. This includes the following program requirements.

- ♦ Orientation, August 14, 2023, 9:00 am 12:00 pm
- ♦ Weekly meetings with mentor
  - Can be by Zoom, phone, or in-person, schedule to be determined by mentor and fellow
- Research journal (Google form, due weekly, should be completed between Thursday and Sunday)
  - Questions change weekly, sometimes include required attachment
  - Approximately 10 minutes to complete
- **♦ Symposia: 90 minutes** 
  - Monthly (exception: there will be two in October) and currently all scheduled to be virtual (<u>here</u>).
  - Topics relevant to research and Mellon Research Fellows journey, followed by informal discussion
  - Required to attend each symposium. If you cannot attend, please let us know *in advance* if an accommodation needs to be made for attendance at a symposium.
- Annotated bibliography (Attached to research journal four times in fall and winter)
  - Kept throughout research journey and shared and discussed regularly with mentor
  - Specific format of annotated bibliography will be determined with your mentor, based on your topic, kinds of sources, type of research, your style and theirs. Will generally include:
    - o One entry for each source (article, book or book chapter, video, podcast, etc.)
    - o 2-6 entries per month (depending on type of source, type of research, point in project)
    - o Brief (1-2 sentence) summary of source
    - o Useful quotes
    - o Reflection on how the source helped answer your research question or develop your project
  - For an example, click <u>here</u>
- ♦ Prospectus (Due with research journal Dec 3)
  - One-page summary of your topic, the format of your final project. (*i.e.* an academic paper, documentary, podcast series, etc.), your spring timeline, and guidelines generated by the student and faculty mentor to assess the final project
  - Approved by faculty mentor (prior to submission) and director (after submission)
  - For an example, click <u>here</u>
- ♦ VCU faculty connection (assigned and introduced in spring semester)
  - Advisory/consulting opportunity
  - Meet twice in spring
- Informal Get-Togethers (optional): are an opportunity for fellows to talk about their experience and share concerns and advice. They will all take place virtually <a href="here">here</a>. Dates for fall and spring are in the <a href="here">MRF</a> <a href="here">Mentee Updates</a>.
- ♦ End-of-Year Poster Session and Celebration: May 9, 2024




#### **Research Journal**

The research journal is due weekly on Sundays. It is intended to be a check-in on your progress and experience, and will be reviewed weekly by Janelle and La'Tifha. Some of the information may be generalized, anonymized, and shared with mentors or program evaluators, but the individual responses aren't shared. You will be emailed a link to the journal or may find them in the <a href="MRF Mentee Updates">MRF Mentee Updates</a> and the questions will change each week. We expect the form to take approximately 10 minutes for you to complete. An example is below.

#### Mellon Research Fellows Student Schedule

The Mellon Research Fellows research journey can seem enormous and daunting at times, and we want to provide a structure that allows you to focus on the process rather than the end result. The deadlines and elements below will help you with the "project management" of the Mellon Research Fellows experience.

#### **Academic Year Overview**

**August** and **September** are about exploring your topic(s), going down rabbit holes, taking notes on what you read/see/watch/listen to/think about, thinking about what interests you, and developing a research question.

In **October**, you'll hone your research question, continue your exploration, and start to answer your research question.

In **November** and **December**, you'll continue exploring your topic and answering your research question, decide on your final project format, and turn in your prospectus.

**January** and **February** are about reading, watching, and listening, but less of it. You'll be organizing your information and your thoughts and taking the first steps of working on your final project.

In March and April, you'll turn in the first draft of your project and work towards and complete the final draft.

By **May**, your final draft will be done and your focus will turn to creating a poster, sharing and celebrating.

#### Important Dates to remember

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October 8	Students turn in their current annotated bibliography. Stipend pay period 1 for students.		
October 22	Mentor and Mentee decide if IRB is needed		
November 19	Students turn in their current annotated bibliography through their research journal.		
Dec 3	Students turn in their prospectus. Stipend pay period 2 for students.		
January 21	Students turn in their current annotated bibliography through their research journal.		
February 18	Students turn in their current annotated bibliography through their research journal.		
March 10	Students turn in the draft of their final project. Stipend pay period 3 for students.		
April 21	Students submit their final projects electronically		
May 9	Poster presentation and celebration. Stipend pay period 4 for students.

Mellon Research Fellows are required to attend nine symposia on topics related to research and the research experience. All symposia are scheduled to be virtual, held <a href="here">here</a>.
